SUPERVISOR'S SUPPLEMENTAL 2007 YEAR-END REPORT TOWN OF RENSSELAERVILLE

In the last Newsletter I offered the first part of my 2007 report, and this is the next installment.

In an effort to communicate better with everyone in our Town, we have:

Created a Town website that makes information available at all times, and since all Town business is posted there, we now have total transparency. Everyone can see everything we're doing.

Publicized Town Board meetings, with the result that attendance has quadrupled. More citizens are taking part in the process of self-government. Improved the Newsletter in format and content. We've started getting twice as much advertising.

To govern more effectively, we have:

Introduced wireless broadband and cable into the Town Building which enables Town officials and staff to be more productive.

Established a policy of hiring part time experts from the Town to rebuild facilities as needed. We saved \$35,000 by using this system on the Town building and will also do the same thing with the new firewall.

Created the Comprehensive Plan (a 300 page document) that guides us in how we develop the Town. The Comprehensive Plan is now Town Law.

Initiated a policy to supervise expenditures over \$200, which we did not have before. As a result we are paying less for motor oil, culverts, stone, paper, trucks and truck parts, etc. With this improved supervision, we will save hundreds of thousands of dollars over the years.

We are also proud of a strong increase in Volunteer activities, as shown by:

Rallying a team to help Sheila Whiteford's flooding.

Enlarging the Town committees to involve more of our citizens.

Taking youngsters on trips to Shea and Yankee Stadiums

The private contributions of money (\$60,000+), time, equipment, and volunteer work refurbishing the Little League field in Preston Hollow—the kind of public-spirited improvements that makes our land and homes more valuable.

These accomplishments continue to show that we have brought the Town and its government to a higher level of performance in its history, and next month I will offer the rest of the 2007 report.

Supervisor Nickelsberg answered questions from the audience and board members.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 8 PM.

ZONING AND SUBDIVISION LAW**


After almost two years of work, our town now has a Comprehensive Plan, with Zoning and Subdivision Laws, voted on and approved by the Town Board on December 19, 2007.

All of us owe the committee members our thanks for a job well done, a job that took precious time from family life.


Speaking directly as Town Supervisor, I am most grateful for your superb work and for the genuine accomplishment of which we can all be proud.



Recipes for Winter

The recipes below seem appropriate for this wintry season. They are from *Rensselaerville Receipts*, published in 1974 by the Rensselaerville Historical Society. In addition to recipes contributed by Rensselaerville residents, the book has drawings, historical notes, reproductions of early newspaper ads and home remedies from the past. It makes a practical gift item which is fun to read too. For instance, note the recipe for liniment from the 1880 diary of Peter Weidman. It calls for 1 ounce each of nine different aromatic oils and ends with "Add 3 qts. of alcohol."

And a list of "Rules for Eating" includes "Do not bring to the table your dislikes, your prejudices, your annoyances, your past misfortunes, and your future forebodings. They will spoil the best meal."

BERTHA HALLENBECK'S HOLIDAY CAKE

1 cup ground cranberries
 ½ cup chopped nuts
 ¼ cup sugar
 1 tsp. mace
 3-oz. pkg. cream cheese
 1 pkg. lemon cake mix
 ¾ cup milk
 4 eggs

Mix cranberries, nuts, sugar, and mace; let stand until cake gets mixed. Soften cream cheese and mix well with the cake mix, milk, and eggs. Beat well. Fold cranberry mixture into cake mix. Pour batter into greased 2-quart fluted mold and bake for 50 minutes at 350. --Bertha Hallenbeck

SPICED CIDER

2 quarts sweet cider
 2/3 cup brown sugar
 1 stick cinnamon
 1 tsp. whole cloves
 1 tsp. whole allspice
 Dash nutmeg

Heat cider and sugar together; add whole spices. Simmer 10 minutes. Strain and serve with nutmeg. --Eva Mae Roney
